Claresholm. The Dr. Ammann entry came from the class for bulls born Jan. 1 to Mar. 19, 1963. Wetmore Domino AGA 2U by HU Wetmore Domino 4R, a sire that had just been named grand champion at the Fort Macleod bull sale two years ago, caught the eye of nearly everyone watching the show. This light-colored, smooth, deep-sided, good-lined bull was marked as a herd bull prospect by most who saw him.

Competition was exceedingly keen in almost every class. Cattlemen watching the show with interest were high in their praise of Judge Noad's work throughout the evening. He consistently selected cattle that were structurally correct and carrying weight and thickness.

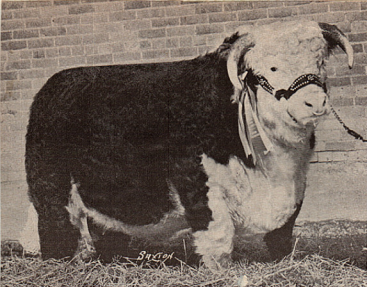
Winning the first class of the evening was Kallal Hereford Ranch Ltd., To field, showing K Royal Krishnagar 70T, an Apr. 24, 1962 son of BHR Royal Krishnagar 3P. This is a rugged bull, thick-made, stylish and massive. Second place in this class for bulls born in 1962 went to Oron Santee, Ponoka, showing Bigbeef Wetmore Britisher 42T by LRD Wetmore Zento 33R. This was the biggest bull of the show weighing 2200 pounds. Third place was won by R. A. Hilgartner, Wetaskiwin, with Gwen Wetmore Mixer 62T, an October 1962 son of Wetmore Mixer LRD 8M.

Standing second in class to the reserve senior champion was Evelyn

W. A. Chapman, Stettler, Alta., showing Atomdale Vern Lad 41U, bested the top competition from eight classes at the 65th annual Calgary Bull Show, Mar. 15. This popular April two-year-old son of Bar Pipe Vern Standard 52R was named the grand champion by judge-of-the-show Ed Noad, High River, in a tremendous display of Herefords before a capacity crowd. The dam of the champion is an own daughter of Britisher Mischief 51st. "41U" was a popular bull prior to the sale when viewed in the stall and was even more impressive in the ring with his straight legs, bone, width and excellent carriage.

The reserve grand champion of the show was the reserve junior champion

entry from Stauffer Farms Ltd., Evarts. Real Krishnagar Image 37U by BHR Royal Krishnagar 8P won the class for bulls born June 1 to June 30, 1963. This young bull was a notable individual when paraded, stood on an excellent set of legs, and carried bone and tremendous length of rear quarter.

The Jones Hereford Ranches Ltd., Balzac, had a very popular entry in the class for bulls born Mar. 20 to Mar. 31, 1963. Their JHR Dermot Baldwin 66U by JHR Dermot Seth Dom 3S not only won his class but made an impressive senior champion with his good fleshing over the top, thick loin, style and weight-for-age. He won the senior championship over a very stylish entry from the Dr. Ammann Hereford Ranch,
